Call for Manuscripts

Texas Speech Communication Journal Volume 44, Issue 1

The Texas Speech Communication Journal issues a call for papers that focus on research in human communication. Contributors may approach topics from multiple perspectives, contexts, and methodologies supported within the discipline. Manuscripts should be received no later than March 31, 2018. Texas Speech Communication Journal (TSCJ) follows a policy of blind review so no author identification should appear in the abstract and body of the manuscript.

Manuscripts should not exceed 25 pages, including references and figures, and should be written according to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (6th edition). The manuscript should be emailed to the editor at the address listed below divided into the following two (Microsoft Word) documents:

- 1. Title Page should include the author's name(s), academic position, institutional affiliation, full mailing address, telephone number, email address, brief author biography, and a history of the manuscript (presentation at conferences).
- 2. Abstract and Manuscript An abstract of not more than 150 words should accompany the manuscript. The author should also include keywords for the articles. *No author identification should appear in this document.*

The Texas Speech Communication Journal (TSCJ) is a state journal published by the Texas Speech Communication Association. The TSCJ produces one print and one online issue per academic year, and seeks to publish original scholarship that makes a contribution to the studies of human communication. An external committee blind reviews all submissions.

In 2006, the dictionary people at Merriam-Webster performed a great public service by bestowing its "Word of the Year" award to "truthiness." A phrase coined by Stephen Colbert just moments before airing an episode of The Colbert Report. Colbert explained that truthiness is not about "truth, we're talking about something that seems like truth – the truth we want to exist." A decade later, the Oxford Dictionaries chose "post-truth" as its word of the year for 2016. Oxford describes post-truth as "relating to or denoting circumstances in which objective facts are less influential in shaping public opinion than appeals to emotion and personal belief."

We can assume that neither Merriam-Webster nor Oxford was thinking about teachers and students when choosing the words, but the dawning of a thruthiness/post-truth era illuminates a number of major challenges for progressive-minded teachers. As Communication professionals, these facts demand that we reevaluate how we teach media literacy, but it also makes clear the work we must do to reinvigorate our approaches to inspiring students. How will we adapt to this new era? How will we inspire them to become more patient, open-minded readers? How will we inspire them to become more patient, active listeners? How will we inspire them to become more patient, critical thinkers?

How will we teach them to identify and respond to the truth?

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
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


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
