STORY TIME: THE GRADE REDEMPTION PROJECT



For many high schools, the end of a grading period is fast approaching. And with that, comes the emails. "What can I do to get my grade up?"

This semester has been particularly difficult with weather closures and an uptick in covid cases in January. Offering an alternative assignment that allows students to show their knowledge and understanding of content may be just the thing to support academic achievement while maintaining accountability in terms of not re-opening old assignments.

This project is flexible in terms of the course that it's offered in - and allows for creativity from the students!

Have students write a 2-page story with 2-3 pictures (drawn or computer-generated) using one of the below prompts:

- 1. Communications Course: Students will write a story about two main characters engaging in a conflict. Through the story, students must show a knowledge of the type of conflict, the communication barriers that are impacting effective communication, and use an effective resolution strategy to overcome the conflict.
- 2. Oral Interpretation/Theatre: Students will write a story centered around a character they are playing. The catch? The story cannot center around the main conflict that is present in the script they are performing. Instead, they should identify a secret of the character that they would like to explore. Through the writing, students will reflect the relationships impacting their characters, and what other circumstances are driving their super objectives.
- 3. Debate: Students will write a story that represents a logical fallacy. Through the story, students must show a knowledge of the type of logical fallacy, how it impedes communication and knowledge, and how to overcome or negate the logical fallacy.
